A Look Back: Johnsville's Catholic Church

Catholic residents of Johnsville started building their church (pictured at right) in the summer of 1899 and completed it in 1900. A priest from the church in Downieville rode a mule for more than 40 miles over the mountains to Johnsville every other week to say mass in the church, which was in use until the early 1920s, when the mines started closing and townspeople began relocating throughout California.



Today, the rebuilt church serves as the headquarters for the nonprofit Johnsville Historical Society, which bought the building from the Catholic archdiocese in Sacramento (see the building as it looks today on the previous page). When I and other Johnsville residents and visitors were restoring the church, we discovered an up-turned iron horseshoe embedded in the front-left corner of the building—perhaps to bring a little extra good luck to the miners and their families.
